Message from the Prioress...

Transitions

Lord, send down your spirit and renew the face of the earth! I write this Prioress's Reflection as we begin the Liturgical transition from the Easter Cycle, ending with Pentecost, to begin the Ordinary Time Cycle of the Church Year. We have continued to be nourished by the Scriptures and its teachings to send us into the next transition in our lives.

Here at Sacred Heart Monastery, the changes in our lives and space have continued. On December 19th, we enjoyed the presence of key persons from Benedictine in Minnesota, now the sole corporate member of Villa St. Benedict. They traveled to Lisle for the final signing of paperwork, and we celebrated with a prayer service and meal.

The Sisters have downsized our living space and moved to the 2nd floor of our Monastery (from 4 floors in 2005) at the east end of the building. Benedictine in Minnesota now has the responsibility to repurpose unused spaces to prepare for the expansion of Villa St. Benedict. The Sisters have chosen to continue to take care of the liturgical ministries in the Chapel and upkeep the Grotto for as long as we can. We have many residents, as well as non-residents, involved with various ministries in Chapel, and Father Becket remains our Chaplain – now close to 25 years in that capacity!

Our own lives have more fully transitioned into the lives of the residents here. We now eat with them, in either the Benedale or Villa Center dining room. It has been truly life-giving to get to

know them and share stories.



A bit of history: The current Benedale Center dining room is located in the same area where Sacred Heart Academy girls ate from 1929 to 1967, where the Sisters and our guests ate from 1967 to 1987, and where the 32 Queen of Peace Retirement Center residents, plus workers and the Sisters ate together from 1987 to 2005. From 2005 until 2023 the Sisters had our own dining area in our Monastery section.

Our Divine Office and community prayer space is now in what had been the sewing room of the

Academy. In 2020 we had transitioned our Divine Office prayers from the Chapel into our Chapter Room, and in 2022 moved again into our smaller Community Room.

To nurture our own sense of community, we try to meet and eat together on Sundays. We share thoughts and concerns by engaging in a "Wisdom Circle conversation" on one Friday night a month, and also hold Community meetings. We celebrate our birthdays and some holidays with an afternoon ice-cream or



cheese and cracker social. We truly have the best of both worlds in this, "our preferred future". God bless each of you as together we find and serve the person of Christ in one another.

Celebrating the Transition of Sponsorship

December 19, 2023 was celebrated with Mass, a lovely meal, and a program of thanksgiving to God and to all those involved in helping the Sisters



achieve approval to become residents of Villa St. Benedict. Key people represented BENEDICTINE, the sponsor headquarters in Minnesota: Jerry Carley (CEO), Kevin Rymanowski (CFO) and Sister Joan



Marie Stelman (Vice President of Mission Integration). Ben Woit, lawyer for BENEDICTINE, and Brien Nagel, lawyer for the Benedictine Sisters, also attended. Villa St. Benedict was represented by Executive Director Joe Kellogg, Director of Nursing Kathy Benjamin and other staff members. The Sisters of SHM community were present, including Sisters Margaret Mary Schima and DePaul Stava, now residents at St. Patrick's Nursing in Naperville. Sister Regina Ann Weissmann, also residing at St. Pat's, was not able to come due to poor health.

Five years earlier the Sisters conducted a self-evaluation study, as they realized their years as a monastic presence were gradually coming to fulfillment. On August 18, 2018, Monastic Council members Sisters Mary Bratrsovsky, Sharon Marie Stola, Judith Ann Heble, Helen Jilek and Carolyn Sieg met with Villa St. Benedict sponsors Jerry Carley and Kevin Rymanowski to formally apprise them of the Sisters' desire to be folded into the care of Villa St. Benedict. At the time both BENEDICTINE from Duluth and the Lisle Benedictine Sisters had dual sponsorship of the Villa. The



Sisters would cede their sponsorship portion in exchange for becoming residents of Villa St. Benedict. The Monastic Council then had to inform the proper authorities and receive permission to move forward with the Sisters' decision. The work-up to the final authorization included the Bishop, the Vatican, the Monastic Congregation President, plus civil authorities of the county and state. The sense of accomplishment and gratitude ran deep

when all the details of the process became final. We are especially grateful for Sister Judith Ann Heble's foresight and hard work to accomplish our preferred future.







The 19th annual Women's Day of Reflection sponsored by the Byzantine Catholic Archeparchial Office of Religious Education took place on April 27, 2024 at the Cathedral of St. John the Baptist in

Susan Koeppen, journalist and anchor for WPXI-TV, shared her story of survival and gratitude. At age 39 while out for a run, she experienced cardiac arrest. Two bystanders, who happened to be medical students, immediately performed CPR and saved her life. This gratuitous life-giving deed on the part of strangers gave Susan a profound sense of compassion and gratitude. Ten years later, she herself had the opportunity to return the favor by administering CPR to a gentleman who was also under cardiac arrest and saved his life.

As Christians, we are called to show compassion to people most in need. Even the iconic fashion designer, Oscar De La Renta once said, "The qualities I most admire in women are confidence and kindness."

The second presentation was given by Lee Goldman Kikel. In the midst of the rise in anti-Semitism, her story could not have been more gripping and inspiring. After her father's death, in 2015 she listened to tapes left by her father, a Holocaust survivor. The story of his Jewish faith, tenacity, and will to survive is compelling. Lee managed to bring to life the narrative of her father's words and documentation of his experience in a book she authored entitled "Perseverance." Benedictine Sisters of the Byzantine Rite Queen of Heaven Convent Now Members of Sacred Heart Monastery

COMMUNITY HISTORY, part 4 by Sister Mary Bratrsovsky

Since 2001, the Sisters at Queen of Heaven Convent had been discerning their future, as their numbers were beginning to diminish. In 2007, the Monastic Chapter voted to become a dependent monastery of Sacred Heart Monastery in Lisle, Illinois. On October 2, 2010, the Congregation for the Oriental Churches in Rome, decreed that Queen of Heaven Monastery of the Byzantine Rite, Warren, Ohio, was officially permitted to change its independent status in order to become a dependent of Sacred Heart Monastery in Lisle, Illinois.

The Lisle Sisters unanimously agreed to grant their request. In a ritual of change of status on November 21, 2010, the seven Sisters in Warren were welcomed by Sister Judith Ann Heble, Prioress, as members of Sacred Heart Monastery, Lisle.

The Sisters planned to remain in Warren, retaining their unique Byzantine spirituality, traditions and liturgical life, and ministering to the people of the Byzantine Church.

At this time in their history they sold Queen of Heaven Monastery on Squire Lane and moved into one wing (8 apartments of the 42 available) of the newly built Infant of Prague Manor on the campus of the parish of SS. Peter and Paul Byzantine Church.

On June 1, 2021 the Trustees of Queen of Heaven Monastery admitted that the internal life of the community was no longer sustainable or viable and thus voted to begin the procedure for the dissolution of the Corporation of Queen of Heaven Monastery by a unanimous vote of the three trustees present. At that point they became members of Sacred Heart Monastery. It was agreed that, if necessary, for health reasons and care, the Sisters would live at Villa Maria

incredible legacy. Sister Christine Kouba helped to collect and write descriptions for the individual items. Displaying this history honors the




